Thomas C. Hebrank ("Receiver"), the Court-appointed receiver for PWCG Trust, hereby submits this twenty-eighth interim application for approval and payment of fees and reimbursement of expenses ("Application"). This Application covers the period from October 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 ("Application Period"), and seeks interim approval of \$8,205.75 in fees and \$1,480.60 in expenses, and an order authorizing the Receiver to pay, on an interim basis, 80% of the fees incurred (\$6,564.60) and 100% of expenses incurred.

Detailed descriptions of the services rendered by category as well as expenses

are contained in Exhibit A attached hereto. During the Application Period, the Receiver and his staff have spent 24.2 hours at an overall blended billing rate of \$339.08 per hour. The Receiver has discounted all fees by ten percent (10%) from regular hourly billing rates. The financial status of the receivership estate during the Application Period is reflected in the Receiver's Twenty-Eighth Interim Report filed on February 6, 2025.

G. Costs

The Receiver requests the Court approve \$1,1,480.60 in costs. A detailed listing of each expense is summarized in Exhibit A. The Application Period included the document shipping charges, as well as monthly costs for the receivership website and investor mailings.

II. FEES AND COSTS INCURRED AND PAID TO DATE

From inception of the receivership through December 31, 2024, the Receiver incurred fees and costs of \$761,505.34, of which amount \$142,784.91 is subject to holdback pending approval of the Receiver's final fee application at the conclusion of the receivership, \$9,686.35 is awaiting the Court's review and approval, and \$610,667.23 has been approved by the Court and paid to date. During the same time period, Allen Matkins has incurred fees and costs of \$1,813,535.15, of which amount \$354,062.06 is subject to holdback pending approval of Allen Matkins' final fee application at the conclusion of the receivership, \$2,975.25 is awaiting the Court's review and approval, and \$1,457,032.89 has been approved by the Court and paid to date.

III. STANDARDIZED FUND ACCOUNTING REPORT

Attached hereto as Exhibit B is a Standardized Fund Accounting Report covering the time period from October 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 to coincide with the end of the Application Period.

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IV. THE REQUESTED FEES ARE REASONABLE AND SHOULD BE ALLOWED

"As a general rule, the expenses and fees of a receivership are a charge upon the property administered." *Gaskill v. Gordon*, 27 F.3d 248, 251 (7th Cir. 1994). These expenses include the fees and expenses of this Receiver and his professionals, including Allen Matkins. Decisions regarding the timing and amount of an award of fees and costs to the Receiver and his Professionals are committed to the sound discretion of the Court. See *SEC v. Elliot*, 953 F.2d 1560, 1577 (11th Cir. 1992) (rev'd in part on other grounds, 998 F.2d 922 (11th Cir. 1993)).

In allowing fees, a court should consider "the time, labor and skill required, but not necessarily that actually expended, in the proper performance of the duties imposed by the court upon the receiver, the fair value of such time, labor and skill measured by conservative business standards, the degree of activity, integrity and dispatch with which the work is conducted and the result obtained." *United States v. Code Prods. Corp.*, 362 F. 2d 669, 673 (3d Cir. 1966) (internal quotation marks omitted). In practical terms, receiver and professional compensation thus ultimately rests upon the result of an equitable, multi-factor balancing test involving the "economy of administration, the burden that the estate may be able to bear, the amount of time required, although not necessarily expended, and the overall value of the services to the estate." *In re Imperial 400 Nat'l, Inc.*, 432 F.2d 232, 237 (3d Cir. 1970). Regardless of how this balancing test is formulated, no single factor is determinative and "a reasonable fee is based [upon] all circumstances surrounding the receivership." *SEC v. W.L. Moody & Co., Bankers (Unincorporated)*, 374 F. Supp. 465, 480 (S.D. Tex. 1974).

As a preliminary matter, the Judgment appointing the Receiver confers on the Receiver substantial duties and powers, including to conduct such investigation and discovery as is necessary to locate and account for all receivership assets, take such action as is necessary and appropriate to assume control over and preserve

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receivership assets, and employ attorneys and others to investigate and, where appropriate, institute, pursue, and prosecute all claims and causes of action of whatever kind and nature. See Dkt. 145, Section III. The Receiver believes this fee request is fair and reasonable and the fees and costs incurred were necessary to the administration of the receivership estate. The Receiver has submitted a detailed fee application which describes the nature of the services rendered, and the identity and billing rate of each individual performing each task. See Exhibit A. The Receiver's request for compensation is based on his customary billing rates charged in similar matters, discounted by 10 percent. The blended hourly rate for all services provided during the Application Period is \$339.08. The Receiver's billing rates are comparable or less than those charged in the community on similarly complex matters. V. **CONCLUSION** The Receiver has worked diligently and efficiently in fulfilling his duties and has provided valuable service in that regard. WHEREFORE, the Receiver requests an order: Approving \$8,205.75 in fees and \$1,480 in costs incurred by the 1. Receiver during the Application Period and authorizing payment on an interim basis of \$6,564.60 in fees and \$1,480.60 in costs from available receivership estate cash; and 2.
